Ordering Resources from NZCETA

- All prices are GST inclusive.
- Orders will be accepted via website order form or email.
- Telephone orders are not acceptable.
- **Ordering via Website:** www.nzceta.co.nz go to Home Page; select Services; select Resource Information; scroll to select either CETA Education Services Order Form or CETA Education Services Practice Exams Order Form.
- **Ordering via Email:** CETA Education Services Order Form or CETA Education Services Practice Exam Order Form will be sent to members with all CETA News and all CETA Chats, or email to request an Order Form.
- When ordering resources from a CETA Catalogue, write the resource name and code number in the blank space provided on the Order Form and ensure you complete the final section, which includes the administration charge for Processing and Distribution.
- Resources are distributed online via google or email, the exception Posters which are hardcopy only.

Members' Differential:

CETA Receiving a Resource Order

- Resources are delivered online – exception Posters.
- **Sales and Distribution Fee:** A flat fee is payable on all orders to cover processing and distribution of the order. Please remember to Include this in the order total.
- **Courier Services used for Poster Orders:** The courier service CETA uses requires all mail to be addressed to a street address. For this reason, it is essential to supply a school street address on all poster orders.

Payment for Resources

ACTIVITIES TO PRACTISE VOCABULARY SKILLS	TR/MM 21/3	\$50.00	<p>This resource is designed to improve the knowledge of te reo vocabulary and confidence in using te reo in our learning area. The activities cover language and ideas relating to Accounting, Business Studies and Economics. Activities include flash cards, bingo games and self-marking practise of vocabulary. These could be used as introductory activities or to build confidence throughout the year.</p> <p>Flash cards – these are broken into 3 categories. Red - general business/commerce ideas Blue – accounting specific terms Grey – economics specific terms These could be used as a template for students to make their own cards from (and add to) or simply printed and folded in half.</p> <p>Bingo – this focuses on the general business and commerce ideas. Bingo cards have been preprepared, alternatively students could choose from the list of terms which they would like to put on their own bingo board. Te Reo boards – one person describes the idea in English and students cross off if they think they have the te reo term for that idea. English boards – one person says the te reo term and the students cross off if they think they have the English translation of that term.</p> <p>Self-mark excel – this gives learners a chance to practise their skills individually with instant feedback. This activity covers the same terms and ideas as Bingo.</p>
